Choosing To Listen

Jean Allen

"See my eyes, I can hardly see. See me stand, I can hardly walk.

I believe you can make me whole. See my tongue I can hardly talk.

See my skin, I'm a mass of blood. See my legs I can hardly stand. I believe you can make me well. See my purse, I'm a poor poor man." (Jesus Christ Superstar)

Jesus told the leper not to go broadcasting his healing to the world, a command the leper completely ignored. Consequently, Jesus couldn't move freely in the towns and had to set up camp out in the country. Since he could heal people whether he was in the populated areas or out in the countryside, obviously Jesus's primary purpose was not healing. It was teaching. It was hard to teach when there were multitudes beseeching him for healing.


Healing naturally flowed out of Jesus's loving compassion and mercy and when the leper said "If you choose...", Jesus immediately said, "I do choose!" But while he had compassion on the sick, Jesus did not want his ministry to be simply about long lineups of people only wanting to be touched. He wanted to teach people about the real nature of God and he wanted to free people from the unbearable burden of the laws that had been laid on their shoulders. That was his main mission before his

Jesus still chooses to heal but the critical question is, "Do we choose to listen?" Do we go to him when we have needs but fail to seek him to hear what he wants to teach us about himself, about God and about ourselves as we go about our day-to-day living? Are we aware that there is far more to Christ than what he can physically give us? If we don't sit at his feet to hear the Word meant personally for us, we simply become part of the clamoring crowd looking for an answered prayer but not being concerned about the desires of the one we are clamoring to.

He is here for you. Are you here for him?




Pledges for the 2023 Appeal will be accepted until February 29th, 2024.

CCCB Pastoral Letter on the use of social media

The CCCB Episcopal Commission for Justice and Peace has today released its Pastoral Letter on the use of social media titled: "Let Your Speech Always Be Gracious." The release is timed with the liturgical memorial of Saint Francis de Sales, who was known for his graciousness in speech and who is invoked as a patron saint of writers and publishers. Acknowledging the prominent role social media has come to play at an individual and societal level, this timely Pastoral Letter considers the benefits and dangers of social media from the perspective of Catholic Social Teaching. It provides tools for moral reflection and self-examination, and suggests seven commitments by which to be guided for a more ethical use of social media.
