Comparative Studies

Jean Allen

In the parable of the master who entrusted his three slaves with five talents, two talents and one talent respectively before he went away, I see in the background something at play here that we all struggle with from time to time. Comparisons. Comparing oneself to others and finding oneself lacking and unworthy.

Did the slave who was given one talent look at what the other two were doing with the master's money and despair because he didn't have the same kind of smarts as the other two? Did he feel totally lacking in confidence that he could measure up to the other two? He was not only afraid of the master. He was frozen in his fear that he wasn't like the other two.

Something that we don't often pick up in this parable is that Jesus said the slaves were given the money, "each according to his ability." That meant that the master in no way expected the slave with the smallest amount of money to do anything similar to what the other two were doing. In fact, it was none of his business what the other two were up to and how they were succeeding. His business was to understand his own ability and to work within it. That's all the master wanted and expected.

If you've ever read about a saint's accomplishments for God or witnessed someone in your community who seems to be so fruitful in his or her spiritual accomplishments or service and then found yourself feeling guilty and a little bit threatened because you just know you haven't got what it takes to attain those spiritual lifestyles...STOP! Stop and take a deep breath, step back and say, "What they do is none of my business. God has endowed me with everything I need to be what he has called me to be. If it doesn't feel noteworthy and amazing, that's all right. I will walk according to my ability and it will be enough. It will be more than enough."

Comparing yourself to others is called 'Freezing your assets."










Feb. 23 Afternoon departure from Victoria via Vancouver to Mexico City. Upon arrival transfer to hotel for overnight.

Feb. 24 After breakfast we are transferred to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe for welcome Mass. Continue to the "City of Angels"- Puebla for dinner and overnight.



We start the day with a tour to the old city, the Cathedral, Dominican Cloister and the Rosary Chapel. Continue to Tlaxcala and the Shrine of San Miguel del Milagro. Celebrate Mass at the site where St Michael the Archangel appeared to Diego Lazaro in 1631 directing him to the Grotto and to a well of miraculous waters. See the image of Our Lady of Ocotlan burnt into a tree trunk after she appeared to Diego Bernardino in 1531. Perfectly preserved, the image in a tree resides in the Basilica of Our Lady of Ocotlan. Dinner and overnight in Puebla.

After breakfast we visit the small Indian baroque church of Tonantzintla and Cholula Church constructed on the top of Great Pyramid. Continue to the famous "Silver City"- Taxco. We get acquainted with the history of silver mining in Mexico, visit jewels of baroque style architecture - St Priscilla and St Sebastian Church where we celebrate Mass. Dinner and overnight in Taxco.



This morning we depart to Mexico City. Upon arrival we visit the Square of the Three Cultures and continue to the Old and the New Basilica dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe, visited by several million pilgrims every year, built near the location where Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to Juan Diego in 1531. We celebrate Mass and learn about the history of Our Lady of Guadalupe and Blessed Juan Diego. Dinner and overnight in Mexico City.
